Making birch bark canoes

- First at the outset the way it's done in making a birch bark canoe, first of all many pieces of birch bark are gathered. Well then, there are old people here wh... who used to make many uh ... birch bark canoes long ago, the Company –, making canoes for the Hudson Bay Company. And so, they used to have no difficulty making them; it was very easy making a birch bark canoe. Only at that point when you start making the frame you bend the cedars; then you push them in, uh ... the flooring stays as they are cal... the flat ones, the boards which you plane. You use cedar throughout.
- So then [you take] a root, a root which lies in a line beneath a tree in the ground, this is what you lace it with as you make it, use this ... well, uh ... a birch bark canoe. That's how it used to be done when making these canoes. I would always watch the old people again and again as they made them. And I myself used to try also because I want ... in order to help as they made them. And still, I could make a birch bark canoe, should I wish to try to make one, right now, uh ... still. The only thing that would have to be done, I'd fetch birch bark and cedar, that's all. And, and then ... when these boats were made for the Hudson Bay, then they in turn sold them to the people. So then they weren'... nothing used to be expensive at that time. Not like it always is today.
- That's all that used to be done in making those birch bark canoes. They used to be good, though. They were strong too and didn't ... didn't break up as you were paddling, as ... as you sometimes hit a rock. And as you were running on the rapids it was really very good. And many times I've gone upstream using these and downstream too, as I hunted long ago. And that's all they used to do in making them.

That then is the length of this one.
